Sunday School

The National Sunday School Dept. was very active for the period January to June. It started the year with online prayer meeting on January 4. The Bible Engagement Project officially started on January 5, with the LISTEN SERIES.

Sunday School Empowerment was held in different counties on April 5, Heart Trust NSTA offered Customer Service training. Invitation was extended to all workers and interested persons in the churches and communities once they met the criteria of HEART. Base on observations it was well supported.

Sunday School children ages 9 - 18 years old participated in the Golden Mic Competition. Participants were selected at the regional level to compete for championship at the national level, which took place at the



General Convention on April 27, 2025. Children turned out in their hundreds; the area that hosted the Children's Convention was packed to its capacity, creating the need for more chairs. Unsold items from Kids' Convention tuck shop were donated to New Vision Children's Home in Christiana.

During the month of May which is celebrated as child month, the Sunday School Department was asked to conduct the Saturday morning prayer meetings between 5:30 and 7:00. The execu-

tive team was in charge for the first Saturday, after which the three counties shared the other Saturday mornings. Our children were applauded for waking up so early in the morning to participate in prayer. Daily Child's Month nuggets were post in the Sunday School online platforms.

We hosted an online discussion on the Royal Rangers Ministry in May. Leaders shared valuable insights on how to start a Royal Rangers Ministry and discussed its benefits. Additionally, some young men already involved in the programme shared testimonies of personal growth, mentorship, and spiritual impact. This session further solidified the importance of investing in our youth through structured, faith-based programmes.

June 2025: Father-Child Bonding Initiative

On June 14th, all men were encouraged to spend quality time with their children by going to a movie, playing a game, or cooking a meal together. This initiative was designed to strengthen fatherchild relationships and promote intentional bonding experiences. Prayer Network


Greetings to the National Presbytery, Pastors and Ministers. The prayer network ministry has been doing great over the years. We take great pleasure to give God thanks for using



us to impact our nation in this ministry. We meet every Saturday morning 5:30-7:00 with praise, worship and prayer. Prayer requests are submitted to our platform on a daily basis and intercession are made on behalf of these requests. We also have monthly prayer partners praying in different groups like our pastors, Bible College students, Sunday School Department, Family Ministry, and we were able to host an all-night prayer meeting. During that session, pastors and other persons were given an hour to pray, give an exaltation or testimony or a word of encouragement, as the Holy Spirit led. We are inviting other pastors and ministers to come on board with us, as this is getting more and more exciting. Our Sunday School children did exceptionally well.

Testimony

A 15 year old student was raped by a elderly man; her grandmother called for prayer. We prayed for him to be caught by the
police. After eluding the police for several years, he was eventually caught and locked up without bail. The victim, in addition to
suffering embarrassment, faced mocking and ridicule from
school mates. Overwhelmed by the situation, she fatally stabbed
a male student. She was arrested and locked up for six months.
According to the lawyer and the judge, the penalty was a 20 year
sentence. During that time her mother had a stroke and was
hospitalized. We prayed, and she was discharged from the
hospital. The Lord also sent a new judge on the case, who said
the child was traumatized and needed to be home with her family. The trial for the man was held and sentencing will be in October. To God be the glory. Hallelujah!



Evangelism and Missions

International Missions Outreach

A mission's team from Jamaica successfully attended an international outreach in Grand Cayman from May 17 to May 23, 2025, for one week. The team engaged in various evangelistic activities including community outreach, church—services,



and ministry to youth and families. The impact was notable, with local churches in Grand Cayman expressing deep appreciation and openness to continued partnership.

National Evangelism Events—On July 12, 2025, National Distribu-



tion Day was observed with an initiative held in all churches across the island. Gospel tracts, invitations, and outreach materials were shared persons within the church communities as part of a coordinated evangelistic push. The

event demonstrated unity and active participation among congregations across the country.

National Online Crusade—Following the tract distribution, a National Online Crusade was held on Sunday, July 13, 2025, where all churches participated virtually. The crusade was broadcast live, and featured powerful preaching, and worship. Many churches reported increased online viewership and engagement during and after the event.

Upcoming Church Strengthening Initiatives—Planning is currently underway for Church Strengthening Initiatives across the island before the end of 2025. The focus will be on sowing seeds of growth, discipleship, and leadership training. The three counties — Cornwall, Middlesex, and Surrey will each organize, plan, and execute regional events that may include: leadership development workshops, evangelism training sessions, community engagement initiatives, discipleship and follow-up programmes dates and details are currently being finalized in collaboration with county coordinators and local pastors.
